AGENDA: 1. New members progression _ Andrew Fluck guest.	Current format of 12 week come and try with temporary membership is being used for ongoing access to the club, with people re-signing for another 12 weeks once the initial 12 weeks have been used. This results in people using club facilities on an ongoing basis without contributing to the overall running and upkeep of the club. This also creates an insurance issue, with AA only covering people for the initial 12 weeks of temporary membership as this is not an ongoing format.	Proposed change of current 12 week come and try to 8 + 4 week visits. The initial 8 weeks will be aimed at introducing the participant to the sport and encouraging improvement and fun in the club environment as well as getting comfortable with the sport of archery. The last 4 visits will focus on training with OZ bow that allows the participant to further their knowledge and technique – then on the 12 th week this can be an afternoon shoot with the members if they choose. A new process for the 12 weeks is to allow the 10 steps of archery to be introduced during the fun shooting, with more formal emphasis on instructing the temporary members through the 10 steps and coaching into the sport and membership of the club. A fee return incentive on joining for the first year on purchase of first bow when becoming a member.

4. Indoor emergency exit and roller door	Incident where member has emergency exit door propped open as was too hot to shoot indoor. Presents safety issue as public can enter from this access while archers are shooting	Chain put across door to advise outside public not to enter if the door is open. Door is to remain closed at all times. Chain put on the roller door behind shooting line. This door can now be opened 1m to allow ventilation in the heat – but cannot be open wide enough that a safety issue of people shooting from inside the shed onto the outdoor range. Approved.
